During his career Jock stood as a testament to what it means to be a criminologist. His passing affects both the field of criminology and those of us who have come to know and love him on a personal level. To know Jock was to know what it means to be a true criminologist and an amazing human being. He was a man devoted to his field and to those who fall under the microscope of criminology. Jock encouraged his students to think critically, to challenge traditional criminology, and to always bear in mind that our work centers on human beings not numbers. With his revolutionary works such as the "The New Criminology", "The Vertigo of Late Modernity", and "The Criminological Imagination" he solidified his place amongst the greats of our field. His legacy will live on eternally.
