Colorblind Segregation, Nationalist Integration: The Perplexing Politics of Education in 1960s New York City



Christopher Bonastia is Professor of Sociology at Lehman College and the CUNY Graduate Center, and serves as the Associate Director of Honors Programs at Lehman. Bonastia's research focuses on the politics of racial inequality. He has published two books: *Knocking on the Door: The Federal Government's Attempt to Desegregate the Suburbs* (Princeton University Press, 2006) and *Southern Stalemate: Five Years without Public Education in Prince Edward County, Virginia* (University of Chicago Press, 2012). His current book project examines tensions between New York City's liberal self-image and its persistent unwillingness to address racial and economic segregation in schools and housing.
